





#### Food for Thought by Emanuel Tucker

The ever vicious cycle of raising new Master Masons and removing other masons from the roles has become overwhelming. For an organization to have such a prestigious place in society it would seem as though there should be little, if any, focus placed on membership. From my point of view many individuals who have gained admission have truly lost the meaning of masonry in the same manner as the true word was lost with the death of Hiram Abiff. Have we truly lost the meaning of masonry amongst the money, election processes, titles, poor attitudes, or acts of self-gratitude? Just ask yourself the question, who would you consider to be a model mason? Would it be the Sovereign Grand Commander, the Grand Master, Grand High Priest, Right Eminent Grand Commander, or some other member in the lodge or chapter? These individuals have been able to climb the ladder and attain some of the highest positions but should the positions in themselves be a focal point of masonic growth. It is not meant for everyone to obtain these positions and the possibility of ever obtaining one is slim to none. Instead of focusing on positions at the highest levels we need to teach each other about our basic responsibilities. Once we re-focus and keep our eyes on what's important then our organizations will stop suffering from lack of funds, lack of membership, and lack of participation. Mentorship is key so instead of idealizing mortal men, let's start to focus on the teachings of Jesus Christ and strive to live a life similar to that of Enoch.

Jesus once confronted the Pharisees and told them, "they seek praise from amongst the people where as true followers of God seek nothing." How often have you come in contact with individuals who are seeking positions in hopes of finding some form of praise? How many leaders have you made contact with that do not seek praise and are truly about God's business? Let's go back to the genesis of the candidate being initiated into the entered apprentice degree. Candidates are instructed to believe that masonry exist in their hearts long before ever taking an obligation. Instead of giving instruction and forcing our new candidates to memorize this saying let's act on this and only initiate those who we believe truly have masonry in their hearts. The observance of an individuals lifestyle, how he treats other human beings, reputation, and other intangibles should be considered before ever initiating the candidate.

If the heart is prepared for masonry then it is the head that conducted the preparation. The individuals mind state, willingness to learn, and the urge to seek knowledge, wisdom, and understanding are all key elements that should be considered. King Solomon teaches about all of these different elements in the Book of Proverbs and we, as Companions, should constantly revisit these teachings in order to continue growth. In RAC #90 I believe we have a strong core and are thriving because of the willingness to do God's will, support the organization, and not consume ourselves with who or who's not the High Priest have allowed for us to have many accomplishments. Any Companion can bring forth ideas to the floor and the High Priest will allow a discussion to take place. Recognize your place within the organization and support others who are striving to make a positive impact.

Cecil Rhodes brought the idea of a scholarship to his masonic lodge in either the late 1800s or early 1900s. Because of bickering and internal fighting he would branch off on his own and create the Rhodes Scholarship, the most powerful and influential international scholarship, and now we can see in modern days how powerful Rhodes Scholars are in society. Bro Rhodes did not quit masonry and continued to pay dues until the day he died. He did however stop attending meetings and events so that support his lodge could have been receiving was lost. These are all things that we must think about. How do we improve our organizations? How do we, as leaders, motivate our members to utilize their talent for the greater good of the order? And how do we not make members feel abandoned? This is just some food for thought as we enter the middle of this masonic year. Challenge yourself to bring three ideas to the High Priest that either deals with charity, fundraising, or some other form of support to the community. If membership complies then take the lead and be in charge of the event. Be blessed and continue to do Good Work, True Work, Square Work!!

On Saturday, May 2nd El Paso Holy Royal Arch Mason #90 got up early and prepared a meal for our eldest brethren and their families. We prepared collard greens, macaroni and cheese, cornbread, fried catfish, and savory baked chicken. We actually fried the fish at their homes so the fish would be fresh and hot. The first Brother we visited was Bro. Curtis Brown who's an energetic 90 year old. His date of birth is March 7, 1925. He was raised Master Mason in 1970. It was great seeing his wife and him, who's been married over 60 years and had receive a special letter from President Obama congratulating them on their 60th wedding anniversary! Bro. Brown also received a Collectable check from the President that showed a million dollars for each year of his life, in which the check was written for \$90,000,000.00. Pictures are attached. The next brother we visited was Bro. Peter Wallace 87 years old, who again came to the front door moving like a young man. He was born in 1928, and raised to Master Mason on July 29, 1960. We next visited Bro. Gover D. Bond Jr. who was born and raised in Darlington, Maryland October 12, 1936. He is 79 years old. He made El Paso Texas home in 1962, which is where he was raised to Master Ma-

son in 1967, and join El Paso Holy Royal Arch Masons chapter No. 90 in 1970. He and others in El Paso during those early years made El Paso Prince Hall Masonry bigger and stronger than anywhere else in TX. He spoke patiently about his love for Masonry. Gover D. Bond Jr. touched many Companions over the years. Over ten years ago a Holy Royal Arch Chapter in Germany was named after him. On March 3, 2013 our Most Excellent Grand High Priest Willie J. Tate, bestowed upon Companion Gover D. Bond Jr. the honor of Honorable Most Excellent Past Grand High Priest of Texas. Lastly we visited Bro. Wilson Sparks 95 years old was born in Alabama on December 19, 1919.

He met his wife Yaeko "Cookie" Sparks while being stationed in Okinawa Japan. They have been married for 63 years. He has three children, eight grandchildren, and eight great grandchildren. We asked him about his daily living, he stated he drinks his breakfast which is Aloe Vera Juice, and he eats lots of fruits, vegetables, and occasionally have toast and coffee with soymilk. For his evening meals he eats a lot of seafood, vegetables, rice, and salads, and on special occasions he said he would throw a slab of ribs on the grill. For exercise he and his wife walks one and a half mile five days a week. When asked about his longevity he tells people that he is just truly blessed, and that spirituality is his base. He joined Prince Hall Freemasonry in his early years, following his father and grandfather who were Masons in Alabama's jurisdiction; he became a member of El Paso Holy Royal Arch Masons Chapter No. 90 on November 12, 1965, and has served as a dedicated member since. He still makes meetings and supports the chapter in all its endeavors. He stated recently in a meeting that he is extremely proud of the work our chapter has done, a great compliment coming from someone who has done so much for this order.

We had a great time visiting our brothers and their families. They were extremely grateful for the food and the visit, what was funny is they all kept insisting to pay for their meals. Brother Sparks even tried to sneak money to us, so we slipped it back in his plate, but later we found the money in the back set of my truck (Smiling) we know his daughter probably was the one who did it (Still Smiling). We will find a way to slip it back to him. Bro. James Coleman 93 years old, who I have only talk to on the phone or emailed, yes these brothers do have email LOL, he was raised to Master Mason in 1956. He resides in California

Bro. Roscoe Roberts 94 years old, I haven't had the pleasure of meeting him yet, but we have talked and emailed each other all year. He sounds like a young man. He was born November 19, 1920, and raised to Master Mason in December 1948. He resides in Colorado.




