Companion, that title that's earned after one is exalted in the Royal Arch. We often simplify this term when addressing each other during our regular scheduled meetings but it is very important that we express ourselves in a manner that display our true affection for the craft, brotherhood, and Prince Hall Masonry. According to Macoy's dictionary of Freemasonry the term Companion "is the title by which Royal Arch Masons address each other, and it is equivalent to the word Brother in the Lodge. It is supposed to refer to the companionship which existed among the ancient Jews while in captivity, from the destruction of the first temple by Nebuchadnezzar, by permission of Cyrus, King of Persia."

We are introduced to this terminology as Masons in the third degree. When the craftsman had departed Kings Solomon Temple to search for Hiram Abiff they crossed a sea-faring man. One of the craftsman stated "Companions, he is a sea-faring man." This term Companion holds much significance and when we refer to someone as our Companion that individual should hold characteristics that display a protector, associate, ally, comrade, and most importantly a friend. The term friend is much more intimate than the word brother. The word brother is applied to individuals that share kinship, even though one would hope that brothers would be friends.

The word friend refers to a person who we receive and give wise council to, answer our needs, give and receive prayer from, and give support when he is or is not in our presence. Pythagoras described friendship as "the truest and nearest perfect relationship of all." A friend will stop everything to assist when family problems arise, a friend will be there to assist when you are struggling with certain vices, a friend will tell you what you need to hear versus what you want to hear, and a friend does not live by quid pro quo tactics. Without friendship a bond does not exist between husband and wife, siblings, parents, or one man to another.

Jesus used the term friend when referring to his disciples. He told them, "I have called you friends; for all things that I have heard of my Father I have made known unto you." He did not place himself in the position of master to servant. He met each of them on the level and gave wise council and encouragement in order to continue the work of the father. He also told them that, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." We would hope that a situation like this would never occur but that deep love and friendship should exist in the hearts of Companions. This love should also prompt us to adhere to our obligation as a Most Excellent Master and reveal all things that have been made known to us in Masonry (as long as this person has been obligated in these degrees).

As we refer to back to the time of Nebuchadnezzar it is important to know why Daniel referred to Hanani'ah, Mish'a-el, and Azari'ah, as his Companions. At the time King Nebuchadnezzar was going to kill many wise men who could not interpret his dream. After Daniel explained the situation to them they all prayed for God's mercy and wisdom in order to interpret this dream. God would reveal the secret of the dream to Daniel and he would later inform the King of the meaning. Just think about Daniel in his situation. His life was in danger, he was nervous, and tensions were at a high. He needed a friend to speak with, receive wise council, be a comrade, and a person that would remind him of God's grace.

This is the type of relationship that should exist in Royal Arch Masonry. The Royal Arch degree is not a stepping stone to join other organizations or place an emblem on your car. Once you earn that title Companion you are apart of a movement similar to the one that Jesus left behind for his disciples. Our friendship should give us the tools to achieve, exceed standards set forth by the Grand Chapter, and affect lives of the individuals living in our communities. The term Companion and friend is essentially the same thing. Once we treat each other in the proper manner the undercutting, backstabbing, rumors, and propaganda will stop. Royal Arch Masonry exist in the heart and it is not something that you are apart of by paying an initiation fee and taking an obligation.



The Most Excellent Master degree. What is its significance and why is it mandatory to receive this degree before becoming a Royal Arch Mason? To many it is a simple stepping stone where you take a short obligation then get up and proceed to get prepared to enter the chapter and receive the degree of a Royal Arch Mason. Certainly, becoming a Royal Arch Mason, wearing the red and white along with the consecrated crown, and dawning the red and white apron is intriguing but in order to become a great Companion you must understand the importance of the other degrees.

Verbiage used in our obligations allows us to see where we are in our travels. As an Entered Apprentice you are initiated into the degree, while you are passed to the degree of Fellow craft, and later raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason. Once you show subtle proficiency in the Master Mason degree you are advanced to the degree of Mark Master, inducted in to the oriental chair of Past Master, and received and acknowledged in the degree of Most Excellent Master.

Being received and acknowledged are the two key words in this degree. By showing proficiency in all prior degrees there is no need to require anything special from this brother. At this point in his masonic journey he has traveled to foreign areas; been tried by handshakes, signs, and grips; also shown proficiency in the prior degrees. Also, lets acknowledge that showing proficiency is not simply regurgitating information from a ritual. Proficiency in masonry comes with understanding masonic information that has been distributed, living by obligations taken, displaying brotherly love, keeping integrity, being a backbone in the community, and most importantly serving the Grand Architect of the Universe. Simply put, the requirements for this degree will be meet by the mason long before he is

This degree will take the mason back to the origins of King Solomon's temple. Much of the material will be covered in I Kings Chapter 8. When studying this chapter, it will take you back to blue lodge lectures but instead of going into the story of Hiram you read about the dedication and the Ark's arrival at the temple. In ancient times all Hebrew Priest gave a threefold benediction at the end of every ceremony and many believe it happened during the ceremony of the Ark's arrival. This threefold benediction is represented as 3x3 in the Royal Arch and symbolizes the complete man. The complete man is the man that has control over his physical, psychical, and spiritual being. Remember Ecclesiastes 4:12 "And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is not quickly broken." This completeness of being allows Most Excellent Masters to adhere to their true calling. Fulfilling his duty of passing knowledge to all other masons.

El Maida Children Donation by Emanuel Tucker






