
High Priest Column by Emanuel Tucker

Book of the Quarter (Lost Scriptures by: Bart Ehrman)



"In the first place, let it be deeply impressed that there is not a geometrical form, nor system of locomotion, nor an indication of physiological harmony in Nature, which is not to be found, vastly more advanced and perfected, in the human body."

Various authorities of ancient and mediaeval times have referred to the human body in their philo sophical writings. The masters of the three Acadamies often justified their abstract conclusions by pointing out some pertinent analogy in human organ or function. Plato, Speusippus, Aristotle, and Olympiodorus were particularly given to such practice, and even Socrates held definite opinions as to the "secret ties" between the body and the soul. For the most part, however, the "anatomy of the philosophers" exists only in a fragmentary state. These inconspicuous references have never before been gathered and reduced to order. This is equally true of the vast body of literature produced during the Middle Ages. Brilliant gems of thought in the field of so-called mystical literature elude the casual reader. The mystics of the Renaissance were, generally speaking, of Man—The Grand

Symbol of the Mysteries sounder reason than the term would now imply. It is difficult to judge scholastic merit in a day when all progressiveness was a heresy and all scientists were accused of magic. In old engravings, the devil—horns, hoof, and tail—is depicted assisting Gutenberg to print his Bible. The Greeks inherited the wisdom of Egypt; the Arabs fell heir to the learning of Greece, and Europe appropriated without the courtesy of acknowledgment the culture of the Arabs. The descent of mediaeval scholasticism can thus be easily traced. But there is another factor. Egypt was not the fountain-head of science or philosophy, but was indebted to a still older world. Osiris, the dark god of the Nile, was a disciple of Indian adepts. Northern Asia was not only the cradle of the human race but also the source of those broad streams of knowledge which, pouring from the heights of Himalaya, watered the plains of human progress. Of the later mystics we would call particular attention to Emanuel Swedenborg. Jacob Boehme, and Andrew Jackson Davis. All three have contributed the results of their clairvoyant research in the field of man's subjective life. Swedenborg's littleknown treatise on the brain is most stimulating. Boehme's investigation of the structure of the soul is worthy of more than passing consideration, and the account given by Davis of the phenomenon of death is only rivalled by the occult writings of the ancient Hindus. In his able summary of man from the mystic's point of view, Davis says: "In the first place, let it be deeply impressed that there is not a geometrical form, nor system of locomotion. nor an indication of physiological harmony in Nature, which is not to be found, vastly more advanced and perfected, in the human body." (See The Great Harmonia.) Helena Petrovna Blavatsky, "the faithful disciple of Eastern Masters" and the greatest occultist of the modern world, made generous contributions to occult anatomy. Most of these contributions are among the fragments published under the general title of The Secret Doctrine, Vol. HI, while others are contained among her esoteric papers. Our purpose has been to bring together not all but only a small part of what may be termed the lore of the human body. For the most part, the origins of the various doctrines are set forth in the text. (cont'd on page



Book of the Qtr (cont'd)

Some have come from Eastern scriptures, some from the Hermetic fragments. We have called upon a wide diversity of old authorities and, strangely enough, there is an evident consistency among them conspicuously lacking with the moderns. The sages, furthermore, approached their task with veneration; an underlying realization of the dignity of life adds charm to every conclusion. They viewed the human body not as the man but as the house of the man. Antiquity was convinced of immortality and among the wise the science of the soul occupied first place. Much work remains to be done in the field of occult anatomy. There are many old writings yet to be consulted, libraries unavailable to the public to be explored, manuscripts to be deci-

phered. The Codices of Central America must be made to give up their secrets. The temple libraries of Asia are filled with priceless documents, for in India are preserved records invaluable to science. Our effort, then, is primarily to stimulate interest and to focus the attention of the learned upon this engrossing theme. We are subject to errors which time alone can correct, but the principle of the correspondence existing between man and the world is established upon incontestable grounds. The illustrations are chiefly derived from rare volumes of the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries. The name of Vesalius is prominent among the anatomical drawings, while Robert Fludd and other Rosicrucians are the source for most of the mystical figures. A few—chiefly for the sake of comparison—are taken from modern authors, and recourse was had to special drawings. Where the older authorities differ in the details of their systems, we have not attempted to force a reconciliation, leaving this for specialists in the several fields. The author sincerely hopes that his present effort will prepare the way for greater and more complete works on the subject of occult anatomy.



BEZALEEL and AHOLIAB by Comp. C.W. Wahren



According to the book of Exodus, in the Holy Bible, the Lord, speaking unto Moses, said: 'make me a sanctuary that I may dwell among you' and, again, 'See, I have called by name Bezaleel, the son of UW and 'behold, 1 have given with him Aholiab, the son of Ahisamach'. Thus were these two, Bezaleel and Aholiab, introduced into that Book from whence is derived much of our Royal Arch ritual Neither of them, according to the Royal Arch ritual are mentioned more than the one time, thus: 'Moses, assisted by Bezaleel and Aholiab, erected a Tabernacle in the wilderness', but, nevertheless, both were very important units in the making of the whole Masonic structure. Apparently neither was other than a competent worker in the crafts but, having been chosen by God to assist Moses, both were 'filled with the Spirit of God' which brought out an expertise, wisdom and understanding unknown in those days, or probably since. Many have been the chronicles written about these two artisans and all pay the highest tribute to their skill and ability. Obviously the Tabernacle, which was to be God's House during the wanderings of the Israelites, had to be something special down to the last detail and these two, Bezaleel and Aholiab, under the guidance of Moses, were the God gifted craftsmen to whom were given the job of designing the Tent, or Tabernacle, erecting and covering the same, making the furniture: the Ark of the Covenant, the Mercy Scat, etc., to a terrifically high standard and in such a manner as would enable the Tabernacle to be dismantled and transported from place to place as required by the Israelites' wanderings.

The description of the Tent or Tabernacle varies from writer to writer but most describe its framework as being of inspired geometric design. It is said, according to Albert Mackey, to have been 45 feet long by 15 feet wide and 15 feet high with a sloping roof. It was placed in the centre of each encampment and surrounded by canvas screens some 7 feet high. It had only one entrance and that was in the eastern side. The Tabernacle was divided into two compartments by a richly decorated curtain hung 15 feet from the western end. Thus was formed in the western end a perfect cube and this was the Holy of Holies, entered only but once a year by the High Priest alone. In the Sanctuary, or eastern end, were placed the Table of Shewbread, the Golden Candlestick and an Altar of Incense and it was decorated with curtains of white, blue, purple and red. It is said that this Tabernacle subsequently became the model for the Tabernacle at King Solomon's Temple. Bezaleel's role in all this was to make the fullest use of his ability to design the building. As a Tent, as it may be called, it was of such a size and construction that no two men were able to build it. He had therefore to instruct the many others of superior ability who came seeking to have a share in its construction. In respect of his teaching and instruction abilities, apparently Bezaleel had an abundance of talent and many already well qualified tradesman in gold, silver, brass, wood, stone and cloth, all materials used in the construction of the Tabernacle,

became superb craftsmen as a result of his Divine-inspired guidancewere two sons of the King Alhoyim who ruled the Country who desired instruction by him in the noble work. To this he agreed conditionally that they undertake an oath never to reveal to anyone any of the secrets he may unfold to them without a third person, possessed of those secrets be with them. To this they agreed and so he instructed them in the crafts which they desired. This curious requirement has become known as TheTrible Voice" and meant that, upon his death, there remained but these two Princes to whom the secrets had been revealed. As there was no third person present or likely to be present who was in possession of these secrets they were lost. You will all recall a parallel to this situation during the first three degrees in Craft Masonry. Approaching death, Bezaleel required that he be buried in the Valley of Jehosophat and have erected a headstone such as he deserved and cut thereon the following:

"Here lies the Flower of Masonry superior of many other Companion to a King and to two Princes, A brother here lies the heart all secrets could conceal here lies the tongue that never did reveal. And so the death of Bezaleel resulted in the secrets of the Holy Temple being lost. Many writers and historians refer to Bezaleel as the Holy One and it would appear that in casting about for a symbol of greatness for our masonic lore the choice could just as easily have been Bezaleel as Hiram Abif. About Aholiab, sometimes spelled OHOLIAB and also known by various other appelations there is not a great deal known. Chosen by God to assist Bezaleel and, like Bezaleel, imbued with the 'Spirit of God' to raise his standard of workmanship to the heights of Holy Inspiration, he too was a very capable artificer in cloth, colours, linen, and as an engraver in stone, wood and metals. His particular employment at the building of the Tabernacle was in the manufacturing of the furnishings as these were all made 'on the job' and in this his craftsmanship matched that of Bezaleel. He too was involved in the teaching and instruction of craftsmen who came seeking to play a part in the Holy Work.

Because of this the Tabernacle became a centre of national endeavour, as it became known that all men with adequate skill should contribute to its creation under the supervision of Moses, Bezaleel and Aholiab. The nature of the task required the highest order of craftsmanship as the Tabernacle was to be a place of worship, containing the Ark of the Covenant, the place where God would dwell with His people. It would become the centre of religious life and nationality for the Israelites their most important and revered object. At the completion of this project Aholiab appears to have dropped from prominence whereas Bezaleel carried on with his work for some years."

However, neither has been entirely forgotten, even today.
