Duwan Mason Sr. Guest Speaker at Banquet



Duwan Mason will be the guest speaker at the Annual Franck Bonhomme Appreciation Banquet. He is a very accomplished man that can provide inspiration through his story and give a sense of motivation to all Masons, young men, and others that want to make a positive difference with-in the community. His bio is below:

Duwan M. Mason, Sr. was born on April 17, 1967, in Louisville, KY. He graduated from Iroquois High School on June 1985 and attended the University of Louisville where he played football. He joined the Army Reserves on 1986 while still attending the U of L, and later joined Army active duty in May 1987. He ETS from the Army in May 1993 and worked for the EL Paso Sherriff's department until September 1996. From 1996 to present, he has worked for the Department of Homeland Security (ICE) Immigration and Custom Enforcement. Duwan has been married 19 years to his wonderful wife Kathy. He has five kids, four sons and one daughter.

On September 2000, he was raised to the degree of a Master Mason in Sunset Lodge 76 in El Paso, Texas. A year later he petitioned El Paso Holy Royal Arch Masons Chapter No. 90 to become a Holy Royal Arch Mason. In October 2001, Duwan was exalted to the degree of Royal Arch Mason. He later petitioned DeMolay Commandery No.22 the Knights Templars, and was dubbed a Sir. Knight in November 2001. He later petitioned Rio Grande Consistory No. 24 in July 2002 and was advanced to the 32nd degree of Masonry. In 2014 Duwan Mason, Sr. received the highest level in Masonry, he receive his 33rd degree of Masonry making him a Grand Inspector General. Duwan is also a member of Oro Temple #9 A.E.A.O.N.M.S, NAACP, American Legion Post 832, Northgate Optimist Association, and a member of Unity Missionary Baptist church.

Duwan is highly involved in his community by giving his heart and soul to family, friends, and peers. He speaks to youth groups about education and future endeavors, and he organizes many community events. He supports Breast Cancer Awareness, Alzheimer's Awareness and local orphanages by hosting luncheons and dinners to raise funds for each of these causes. He is always working to ensure El Paso remains a giving city by giving back and encouraging others to give back to the community.



From the local lodge he has received two Master Mason of the quarter and Master Mason of the Year awards. From the HRAM chapter and Grand chapter, Duwan has received companion of the year, EHP of the year, and secretary of the year. From the local Knights Templars, he has received Sir Knight of the year and from the Oro Temple No.9, he received Noble of the year. In 2013, he received an Outstanding EL PASO CITIZENSHIP Award for many years of community services, and in 2015 he received from the Links, Incorporated their UNSUNG HERO award, which is awarded annually to individuals who strengthen their communities through extraordinary everyday acts of service done with reliability and commitment, but who seldom receive recognition.

The Impact of a Leader by Emanuel Tucker

I arrived to El Paso during the summer of 2007. I was only in town for about a week before I headed over to Pride of the West #53 Lodge Hall. At the time I was a member of Andrew Baskin Military Lodge out of Oklahoma Jurisdiction and wanted to continue my knowledge of freemasonry. I had the distinct privilege to meet Bro Bonohmme at the first meeting I attended. We only had a brief conversation but he invited me to his house for Master Mason study hall. I took him up on the offer and would soon meet men such as Benny Moss while



continuing to improve myself in masonry. We developed a very close and special relationship as he instructed me on the principles of this craft and assisting me in using my working tools to further shape and craft the stone that is to be fit for that house not made with hands.

After I returned from deployment in 2009 I learned that Franck had become the Excellent High Priest of El Paso Holy Royal Arch Chapter #90 (RAC #90). There were only four to five Companions attending meetings and the account only had about \$70. Under his leadership members grew, attendance for regular scheduled meetings quadrupled, the dress for the Royal Arch Mason was implemented, PHAmily and Friends BBQ has continued under the Royal Arch banner, Thanksgiving and Christmas celebrations for the community were established, an Annual Banquet was established, our account has grown to well over \$13,000, and Companions receive quarterly communication through distribution of a newsletter. All of this was accomplished through great leadership and a group of Companions that were willing to embody the meaning of what the term brotherhood represents.

Today, more than two years after his passing, the lessons he implemented to RAC #90 have continued to stand strong. The Banquet has been re-named the Franck R. Bonhomme Appreciation banquet, the PHAmily and Friends BBQ continues to host more people annually,

the community now looks forward to the annual Thanksgiving and Christmas Celebration, and our chapter has built a name among local government in El Paso, and many others through the great charity work that is being conducted. Our overall goal is to continue to perform charity events with wishes that these events will grow various individuals' faith in God. Faith, Hope, and Charity have built the principles of RAC #90 and were brought to the chapter with lessons from PHP Bonhomme.

Are we going to fix this or continue to pretend nothing is wrong? Several people will read this and immediately wonder what's going on.




